- He has conflicting birth information of 1695 and Westmoreland County, Virginia.
- Inheritance: he inherited land and slaves from his father Daniel, July 1720, Westmoreland County, Virginia. From his father Daniel's will: Item I give and bequeath to my son Abraham Field the plantacon called Simeon Luckens & all the lower part of the land joyning to the lower branch near the plantacon called Taylors Wilkinson to him and his heirs forever...

Item I give and bequeath to my sons Abraham and Henry all my other estate in the fork of the Rappahannock river in what manner of Kind soever & four negroes Will, Geb, Sam and Peter; one white servant called Catrine Simons
- Land Grant: 800 acres in Spotsylvania County, 5 October 1723, Spotsylvania County, Virginia. "Abraham Field, 800 acs. (N.L.), Spotsyl. Co., in S t. George's Par; in the fork of Rappa. River; on N. side of Flat Run, in the line of William Skrine; to the Mountain Run; 5 Oct. 1723, p. 288. 4 Lbs. Money."

This land is now in Culpeper County, Virginia
- Military: Took an oath for Colonial Militia, 2 February 1730/31, Spotsylvania County, Virginia.

A list of the officers of the Colonial Militia of Spotsylvania County who producing their commissions before the Court of the Majesty's Honorable Justice for the County sheweth, took the oaths as directed by law.

ORDER BOOK—1724-1728.

Captain John Robinson took the oath as Lieutenant of Spots Co., August 2, 1724.

Captain Thomas Chew and his officers, John Shaw and Edward Franklyn; Captain William Johnson and his officers, Andrew Hartman and Thomas Watson took the oath August 5, 1724.

Major Goodrich Lightfoot, Captain Robert Slaughter and his officers, James Kinley and William Purvis; Captain John Scott and his officers, Joseph Hartman and John Adolphus; Captain William Madison and his officers, James Williams and George Hester, took the oath, September 2, 1724.

Captain William Hatched and his officers, John Grayson, Jr., took the oath, October 7, 1724.

Henry White, Gent., before Mr. Hester, William Good, Sen., Lt. Gov., etc. Comissioned to be Lieut.-Colonel of this county, took the oath, August 4, 1725.

ORDER BOOK—1729-1738.

Robert Green, Captain; Francis Slaughter, Lieut.; John Robinson, Ranking; Abraham Field, Captain; Henry Field, Lieut.; Francis Hester, Sergeant of a company of foot, took the oath February 7, 1729-1.

Benjamin Carr, Lieutenant to Captain John Scott, took the oath, Feb. 20th 1729-2.

John Tullahoma, Lieut.-Colonel; Francis Thornton, Jr., Major of the Horse; Francis Slaughter, Captain of the Horse; Richard Parr, Mr. Lieutenant of Horse; Thomas Hill, Captain of a foot company, took the oath, October 6, 1729.

Richard Phillips, Gent., Lieutenant; and Edward Hamilton, Jr., Gent., Corral, produced their commissions and took the oath, etc., as officers to a troop of horse under Captain William Walker. November 1, 1732.

ORDER BOOK—1738-1748.

Neahy Baskley, Gent., produced his commission to be Captain of a company of Foot in this county, and took the oath Apr., 1738.
- Selected Ferry Site: 21 January 1734/35, Orange County, Virginia. Along with Robert Slaughter, Robert Green and Samuel Ball, selected a new ferry site for Germanna
- Chose Location of Orange County Courthouse: February 1738/39, Orange County, Virginia. Along with five other Orange County judges, chose the location of the Orange County, Virginia Courthouse. One of the first Justices in the Orange County Court
- Church Affiliation: Vestryman For Great Fork Church, Bet 1744 and 1774, St. Mark's Parish, Culpeper County, Virginia.
- Civic Duty: 27 April 1749, Culpeper County, Virginia. Was chosen to be in a Commission of the Peace for Culpeper County, Virginia, by a council of justices of the peace.
- Civic Duty: 30 April 1752, Culpeper County, Virginia. Lt. Gov. Robert Dinwiddie appointed first known county justices of peace for Culpeper County. Robert Slaughter, Abraham Field, Francis Slaughter, Robert Eastham, William Russell, Henry Field, Phillip Clayton, James Pendleton, Thomas Slaughter, William Green, Joseph Rogers. The first four had previously served as Orange County justices.
