

Howard Allen Field (1911-1988) worked for the Nappanee Advance-News as well as Vitreous Steel in Nappanee, Elkhart County, Indiana. He was born in Valparaiso and moved to Nappanee with his family in 1927, where he finished high school and worked for his father at the newspaper. His wife was Miriam Elaine Grasz (1918-2009) also of Nappanee, Indiana. Howard and Miriam moved to Turlock, Stanislaus County, California less than a year after this article was written, 1 September 1945.

Howard was the son of Harvey Oliver Field (1889-1966) and Marie Jeanette Eddy (1891-1966) and the 3<sup>rd</sup> great-grandson of Keen Field (1774-1815) and Anna Lewis (1773-1850).
